15:30-17:30 A tour to the Muhraka on the SE tip of Mount Carmel

The views from the Horn of the Carmel at the southern part of the Carmel are breathtaking; they include the landscapes of the Jezreel Valley (also known as the valley of Armageddon) and the Galilee. ³

The Carmel Foundation, known in Arabic as al Muhraka, stands for "Monastery of the place of burning." Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal, an ancient deity, and challenged him to a test of faith – wherein the god that accepted either of their individual sacrifices, with fire, would be considered the true god. According to tradition, only Elijah's sacrifice was accepted by God, when fire came down from heaven and enveloped the bull Elijah had sacrificed. Following this biblical event, Mount Carmel was called "Jabal Mar Elias", which means Mount of St. Elijah, in Arabic.⁴
